

COUNCIL WELCOMES FOUR NEW BROTHERS TO ITS RANKS

All Saints Council 9709 inducted four new members at a 1st Degree Ceremony conducted in conjunction with its Jan. 3 business meeting. Welcome to Brothers Derrick Cole, Frank Menius, Joe Mesiano and Ron Price. In addition two new Knights were exemplified from Our Lady of Lourdes Council 12025 in Raleigh.

The four new Knights bring the Council's membership total to 232; however, the Council's progression to Star Council status remains stymied as a result of 12 pending withdrawals and suspensions so far this year. The Council's goal for the McGivney Award for membership was 15 at the start of the fraternal year. The 12 Knights who withdrew their membership or were suspended upped the goal by that same number. Including the four new Knights brought in on Jan.

3, the Council has brought a total of 10 new Knights into the Order so far for the year, leaving it some 17 new members short of the goal.

The Council is also short on new insurance members. To achieve the requirement for the Founders Award for new insurance members, the Council needs to add six new insurance members. So far this year, the Council has added three, but one Knight dropped his insurance, which added an additional one to the overall goal. At present the Council still needs four new insurance members. The Council currently has 63 insurance members.

Star Council status is determined by whether or not a Council meets its goals for new members (McGivney Award), new insurance members (Founders Award) and documented participation in activities under the categories of Church, Community, Council, Family, Youth and Pro-Life (Colombian Award). The Council has never had a problem with meeting the requirements of the Colombian Award.

COUNCIL REPORTS COLLECTING \$19,313.09 FOR OPERATION LAMB



Operation LAMB Director Brother Tim Stevens reported at the Jan. 3 business meeting that Council 9709 had collected a total of \$19,313.09 for Operation LAMB in calendar year 2011. The total includes personal checks from Brother Knights totaling \$3,025 received after the fall drive, including one very generous and anonymous donation for \$2,400.

"This is well below our record collection last year of \$27,666.87," he noted. "Unfortunately, store policies restricting our ability to schedule dates as well as a soft economy have hurt our efforts. My special thanks to all those who contributed their time, talent, and treasure."

Brother Stevens reported that some 57 Knights and 15 family members volunteered for a LAMB shift in 2011, and that he would try one and one-half hour shifts in 2012 to see if that might boost participation. For the 2010 LAMB drive, some 79 Knights and 30 family members volunteered.

Operation LAMB is run on a calendar year basis, and the Council's spring drive is tentatively set for Friday, April 20, and the weekend of April 28-29. Brother Knights interested in working for Operation LAMB will have the opportunity to sign up for shifts on the Council website.

FOR THE FIRST DEGREE KNIGHT . . . OPERATION LAMB

Operation LAMB is the single largest charitable activity conducted by the Knights of Columbus. Brother Knights in yellow aprons have been soliciting donations from passers by and doling out Tootsie Rolls all across the nation since 1974. Since its inception, the Operation LAMB program in North Carolina has raised over \$20 million for the intellectually disabled in the state. Thanks to the generosity of the state's residents, North Carolina Knights have been raising almost \$1 million annually since 2008. Unlike most of the Knights' activities, Operation LAMB is conducted on a calendar rather than a fraternal year basis.

Brother Knights of Council 9709 solicit donations outside of grocery stores in the northwest Raleigh area. Eighty-five percent of what a Council collects is distributed to local charities. The remaining 15 percent is sent to the State Council where it is distributed to organizations supporting the intellectually handicapped in areas of North Carolina where no local Knights of Columbus Councils exist. Expenses for Operation LAMB are minimal consisting mainly of the purchase of aprons, collection cans and Tootsie Rolls.

For 2011 Council 9709 collected a total of \$19,313.09, well below the 2010 record total of \$27,666.87. All Saints will add its collection for 2011 to the coffers of Father Price Council 2456, Our Lady of Lourdes Council 12025, St. Luke the Evangelist Council 12455 and St. Raphael Council 9880 for distribution to local organizations in Raleigh. Charitable organizations apply for funds from the local Knights of Columbus Councils through a panel with members of each Council represented.

A total of \$44,696.74 was distributed after the 2010 drive to the Arc of Wake County, the Bill Scott Endowment Fund, the Frankie Lemmon School and Development Center, Hilltop Home, Community Partnerships Inc., the Tammy Lynn Center for Developmental Disabilities, the Triangle Down Syndrome Network, the Wake Autism Society, Wake Enterprises, Learning Together and Nancy Frazier of Harris Creek Elementary School.

Operation LAMB derives its name from Christ's words in Matthew 25:48: "as you did it to one of the [L]east [A]mong [M]y [B]rethren, you did it to me."

BROTHER JOE & MARY KANE ARE JANUARY'S FAMILY OF THE MONTH

Council officers have selected Brother Joe and Mary Kane as January's Family of the Month for their extraordinary contributions to the Raleigh Community as well as the Council and Church.

Brother Joe was called home by the Lord on Dec. 8, but not before he and his family had baked cookies for friends, family and various charitable organizations in Raleigh. The Kanes began baking literally thousands of cookies for others in memory of Brother Joe's mother who died in the late 1990s, and the baking became a tradition that will be continued by Mary and their daughters, Kristen Rizzo and Susan Frizell (wife of Brother Dan Frizell) in Brother Joe's memory. The Kane family was actually baking cookies under Brother Joe's tutelage in the Wake Hospice before he died. The family's generosity was also documented in the Dec. 3, 2008, issue of the Raleigh <u>News and</u> <u>Observer</u>.

Brother Joe and Mary retired to Raleigh in 1994 after working for Sun Oil for 28 years and immediately became active members of the St. Francis of Assisi Catholic Community. He served as a Eucharistic Minister for 37 years and was a Knight of

Columbus for 53 years including having attained the 4th Degree. He and Mary were frequent volunteers for Special Olympics, Catholic Parish Outreach and the Salvation Army.

Brother Joe was born on Oct. 31, 1933, in Buffalo, N.Y., and spent four years in the Army before completing college and becoming a licensed funeral director. He was also an active volunteer firefighter.

Some 14 Knights representing four area Councils (nine from Council 9709) formed an Honor Guard at Brother Joe's Resurrection Mass held at St. Francis Friday, Dec. 16. There were at least that many Brother Knights from Council 9709 in attendance at the Mass.

COUNCIL SEEKING NEW NEWSLETTER EDITOR

All Saints Council 9709 is looking for a new newsletter editor for its monthly newsletter. Costs incurred as newsletter editor are covered by the annual budget. The Council newsletter has won third place in the annual State Duane Russell newsletter competition the last two years. The first issue of the newsletter was printed and mailed in July 2006. By the middle of 2006, the newsletter was sent out electronically to Council members by e-mail. There are still some 15 members receiving the newsletter by U.S. Mail.

The newsletter was expanded from four to six pages in October 2009 because of additional State requirements for items that should appear in a Council publication. Specific requirements imposed by State include having an insurance article and naming the Family and Knight of the Month in each edition of the newsletter. The newsletter is also tasked by State with charting the Council's progress toward Star Council status, its Operation LAMB goal as well as other activities. There are also a number of formatting requirements associated with the layout of the newsletter, all of which are current under the existing format. Copies of all newsletters published since 2006 are currently archived on the Council website under "Links and Newsletters" and "Newsletter Archive."

All Saints Council 9709 will be participating in two major pro-life events in January, one in Raleigh and one in Washington, D.C. Council 9709 will again take part in the Rally and March for Life beginning at Nash Square (Hargett and McDowell Streets) beginning at 1 p.m., Saturday, Jan. 14. 4th Degree Knights are encouraged to march in full regalia in the Honor Guard that leads the march (arrive at 12:15 p.m. and contact Sir Knight William Grimes at <u>yowillie@nc.rr.com</u>). All Knights are encouraged to wear their Knights hats and name tags and march with the Council banner.

The relatively short, flat march proceeds at a leisurely pace from Nash Square to the House and Senate buildings on Jones Street and ends at the Raleigh Cathedral. Refreshments are served at the end of the march. Free public parking is available just north of Nash Square.

For those who wish to participate more fully in the day's festivities, there is an 8 a.m. Diocesan Respect Life Mass celebrated by Bishop Michael Burbidge at St. Joseph Catholic Church at 2817 Poole Road followed by the13th Annual Prayer Breakfast beginning at 9:30 a.m. at the North Raleigh Hilton Hotel at 3415 Wake Forest Road.
