COUNCIL GETS STAR AWARD FOR FRATERNAL YEAR 2011-2012

State Advocate Brother John Nussbaum presented the Order's Star Award to All Saints Council 9709 Past Grand Knight Kent Siefkes at the Council's Nov. 6 business meeting. The award covers fraternal year 2011-2012 when Brother Siefkes was Grand Knight.

In order to meet the requirements for the Star Award, a Council must meet or exceed its membership recruiting goal (the Father McGivney Award), its new insurance member goal (the Founders Award) and demonstrate that it has conducted at least four activities each under the categories of Church, Community, Council, Family, Youth and Culture of Life.

The Star Award is the highest honor a Council can achieve in the Order. Council 9709 last won the Star Award for fraternal year 2010-2011. That year the Council was credited with a Double Star Award because of its unusual success at gaining twice the number of new members as its Supreme-set goal.

In order to achieve Star status for fraternal year 2012-2013, the Council must achieve a Supreme assigned goal for membership of 16 as well as six new insurance members. These numbers, however, increase with member and insurance member losses.

FOR THE FIRST DEGREE KNIGHT . . . FATHER McGIVNEY GUILD



The Venerable Father Michael J. McGivney, who founded the Knights of Columbus in New Haven, Conn., in 1882, is a unique model for today's Catholic and today's Catholic Priest because of his attention to the social ills and injustices of his day and his collaboration with the laity. He was zealous for the life of union with God through prayer and the Sacraments, and he would have been right at home in today's world. He was then and would be today an eager Apostle for the Gospel of life and a determined foe of the culture of death.

In view of his legacy, the Order of the Knights of Columbus has established The Father Michael J. McGivney Guild to promote the cause for the canonization of its founder, the Venerable Father Michael J. McGiveny. The goal of the Guild is to spread the good word about his holiness of life, to encourage devotion to his memory and to seek his intercession before the throne of God. The Guild serves as a clearing house for information about the Venerable Father McGivney, his life and works and any favors attributed to his intercession.

Membership in the Guild is open to anyone who wishes to share in this mission of making known the life and work of the Venerable Father McGivney and of encouraging devotion to his memory. All one needs to do is fill out the application and mail it in to become enrolled. There is no charge to enroll, although donations are accepted. Enrollment can also be done via the web by logging on to www.fathermcgivney.org.

Members of the Guild receive a newsletter and periodic updates on the progress of cause for canonization.

COUNCIL WELCOMES FOUR NEW KNIGHTS

2012 LAMB DRIVE TOTALS \$15,004.08


All Saints Council 9709 pulled in some \$3,279.93 in donations over the weekends of Oct. 19-21 and Nov. 2-3, bringing its 2012 calendar year donations total for the intellectually handicapped to \$15,004.08. LAMB Coordinator Brother Tim Stevens announced at the Nov. 6 business meeting that he had secured two more days for collecting donations at the Kroger Store at Creedmoor and Lynn Roads for the weekend of Nov. 10-11. The final LAMB total will be reported in the December 2012 newsletter.

Some 33 Knights, spouses and children filled 44 of the slots for Oct. 19-21 and Nov. 2-3. Last year the Council collected some \$19,313.09 in donations, the fourth highest of any Council in the State. The Council received a special award at the 2012 State Convention in May for having the third highest Operation LAMB per capita collection of some \$88 per Council member. State's goal is \$1 million annually and needs a per capita collection from its 15,800 members of \$65 each to reach that goal.

After several stays at WakeMed and a number of rounds of chemotherapy, the family made a joint decision to suspend further treatment, so Jerome could enjoy a better quality of life during his last months.

In Jerome's own words: "No matter what you do in life, nothing prepares you for this kind of experience. But only one thing gets you through it, your faith. My mother said to me, 'I'm praying for a miracle.' I responded to my mother, 'Mom, I think we are witnessing a miracle.' I said once before in an earlier writing, this is not about me, this is about all of us. This has been a collective journey for all of us involved. I could tell you a thousand stories of how I have felt God's presence and hand throughout all of this."

The love and support from Jerome and Kathryn have yielded a family that would make any parent very proud. Their sons Brock (junior at Notre Dame) and Vince (sophomore at Sanderson HS), along with

daughters Gretchen and Audrey (middle and elementary school at TFS) have a strong faith, are very gifted academically and love to play various sports. All of their kids are shining examples of the result of living in a strong Catholic family and having a great Catholic education. works as a Project Manager for IBM, supporting business analytics and transformation initiatives.



COUNCIL 9709 TO SUPPORT SONC DEC. 2

All Saints Council 9709 will conduct the awards ceremony for the Special Olympics North Carolina (SONC) singles bowling tournament at the Village Lanes in Durham Sunday, Dec. 2. This is the fourth year in a row that the Council has supported SONC's bowling tournament.

Knights interested in helping with the event should send an e-mail to Council Special Olympics Coordinator Brother Ralph Guenther at rguenther2@nc.rr.com. At least 10-12 Knights, spouses and young adults ages 16 or older are needed. The Village Lanes Bowling Alley is located at 330 North Hardee Street, Durham, NC 27703, just off of US-70 at the Route 98 (Holloway Street) exit. Typically, the volunteers are required from about 10 a.m. to 1 p.m.

In the past Council 9709 has supported up to three venues for this event, but when SONC began migrating west into Durham and consolidating



The number of athletes and teams is expected to be about the same as last year, according to SONC Director Kelly Vaughan. Last year the competition involved some 800 registered athletes from across North Carolina. Some 136 singles bowlers competed at the Village Lanes and 165 athletes (15 five-person teams and 45 doubles) bowled at AMF Durham Lanes.

Council 9709 reports its monetary contributions and volunteer hours to Special Olympics to Supreme on two semi-annual reports during the fraternal year. Council 9709 has typically been one of the staunchest supporters of Special Olympics North Carolina in the area. The Council has also conducted awards ceremonies for the annual swimming competition held at the Triangle Aquatic Center in Cary for many years.


