

BISHOP EMERITUS GOSSMAN, 83, DIES AFTER LONG ILLNESS

RALEIGH — Our Beloved Bishop emeritus F. Joseph Gossman, who served 31 years at the helm of the Raleigh Diocese of the Catholic Church during a period of vast growth, died Monday after a long illness. He was 83 years old.

Gossman became the fourth bishop of the Raleigh Diocese at age 45, succeeding Bishop Vincent S. Waters, and served from May 19, 1975 until his retirement June 8, 2006. Gossman was also a 4th Degree Knight and was also a member of our All Saints Council 9709. He received honors with Knights in full Regalia at his funeral mass.

He was a strong proponent of the sanctity of human life and spoke out on issues involving human dignity – from the plight of the poor, to care and concern of immigrants, to strong opposition to capital punishment.

"He was a very holy man, a straight shooter, a clear communicator," said Ron Doggett, who knew Gossman from the time the bishop came to Raleigh. "I used to tease him about his sermons being too long. But he always wanted to make sure he got his message across about being good Catholics and good Christians, and good servants of all those in need in our community: those who are hungry, those who don't have a home or shelter, those who are ill.

DURHAM BALL GAMES SALES ARE OUT OF THE PARK

Brother Mike Wrzesien and several other Brothers working the Durham Ball Park Concessions stand have set new records in sales revenues and tips. A portion of the sales and the tips are filtered into our Council accounts and have far exceeded the Council's budgeted estimates. When the budget was drafted for this Fraternal Year, we predicted revenues of \$4100.00; to date we have far exceeded this prediction with over \$5000.00 in deposits. We still have remaining games for September that will continue to add to our account. We have wowed Center Plate with our record sales.

COUNCIL WINS PRESTIGIOUS FOOD FOR FAMILIES AWARD

The Council received the prestigious "Food For Families" reimbursement Program plaque. The inscriptions on the plaque read, "Behold, I have given you every plant yielding seed that is on the face of the earth, and every tree with seed in its fruit. You shall have them for food." Genesis 1:29. This award was given for our Councils generous donations of over \$2500 to local food banks and agencies that feed the poor. I don't doubt that we will once again achieve the award this fraternal year as well. FOR THE FIRST DEGREE KNIGHT . . . ELECTED OFFICERS

GRAND KNIGHT - The Grand Knight is responsible for the welfare of the Council. He presides over Council meetings, acts as an ex-officio member of all Committees, appoints the Membership and Programming Directors, convenes officers for a monthly meeting and ensures all necessary reports are submitted to the State and Supreme Councils. The Grand Knight's signature appears on all checks drawn.

DEPUTY GRAND KNIGHT - The Deputy Grand Knight assists the Grand Knight with Council affairs and fulfills all the duties assigned him by the Grand Knight. Should the Grand Knight be absent from a Council meeting, the Deputy Grand Knight will preside. He is also Chairman of the Council's Retention Committee.

CHANCELLOR - The Chancellor assists the Grand Knight and Deputy Grand Knight in the execution of their duties and oversees the Council in both their absences. He is charged with strengthening the members' interests in Council activities and is also Chairman of the Admissions Committee.

WARDEN - The Warden is the "watchdog" for Council property and degree paraphernalia, except the property of the Financial Secretary, Treasurer and Recorder. He is responsible for setting up the Council Chambers for meetings and ceremonial work and appoints and supervises guards during ceremonial exemplifications.

TREASURER - The Treasurer is responsible for the safekeeping and maintaining of records of all Council funds and accounts. He is responsible for depositing money into the Council's accounts and provides certificates of such monies to the Grand Knight. He is also responsible of payment of all expenses.

RECORDER - The Recorder is responsible for maintaining a true record of all actions of the Council and its correspondence.

ADVOCATE - The Advocate is the legal representative of the Council and serves as the Council's attorney at trials and investigations of interest to the Council. While he does not need to be a member of the legal profession, he should be familiar with the Council By Laws, Methods of Conducting a Council Meeting and Robert's Rules of Order.

INSIDE AND OUTSIDE GUARDS - The Outside Guard tends to the outer door admitting visitors and members to the inner door. Once at the inner door, the Inside Guard checks to make sure that membership cards are current.

TRUSTEES - The Board of Trustees consists of three members elected by the Council and the Grand Knight, who serves as Chairman. They oversee the work of the Financial Secretary and Treasurer, and with the Deputy Grand Knight, serve on the Council's Retention Committee. Only the three-year Trustee is voted, with the others continuing their terms.

BROTHER DICK NOVACEK APPOINTED DISTRICT WARDEN

District Deputy Brother Dick Bridges announced at the Council business meeting August 6 that Brother Dick Novacek had accepted an appointment as District Warden for District 9. District 9 includes four Councils: Immaculate Conception Council 3390 in Durham, All Saints Council 9709 in Raleigh, St. Luke the Evangelist Council 12455 in Raleigh and Pope John Paul II Council 13812 in Durham.

The District Warden assists the District Deputy in the execution of his duties, attending events that the District Deputy is unable to attend. He also plays an important role in the annual Installation of Officers ceremonies for District Councils. Typically, a District Warden has been a Grand Knight. New District Warden Dick Novacek is a Past Grand Knight of Council 9709.

The District Warden position can also be a stepping stone for the position of District Deputy. A District Deputy officially represents the Supreme Knight in his District and is reimbursed for mileage, lodging and meals for the performance of his duties. The District Warden is not reimbursed for expenses. A District Deputy can serve up to four consecutive one-year terms with an additional one-year extension. There are 29 District Deputies in North Carolina. Each District Deputy can have one or more District Wardens.

Regional District Deputies and State Chancellors are positions established by the State Council of North Carolina and are not recognized by the Supreme Council. Their expenses are reimbursed by the State similarly to how District Deputies are reimbursed by Supreme. There are seven Regional District Deputies and two State Chancellors in North Carolina.
