April Event, 4th Degree Exemplification

SK Thomas W. DuPree, Jr., PFN Exemplification Honoree April 14, 2018

Tom was born in Canada and at 5 months old moved to and raised in Dunn, NC graduating high school in 1962. Tom then graduated from the Univ. of Mt. Olive in 1964 and enrolled in UNC Chapel Hill. Knowing he was about to be drafted by the US Army he joined the US Air Force in January 1966, becoming a drill instructor and them assigned to Amarillo AFB s a Base Level Supply Instructor. In May 1967 he was assigned to Chanute AFB and there he met Elaine, eventually to be Mrs. Tom Dupree. After leaving the Air Force, Tom worked in management for Sears while continuing his education at the Univ. of Illinois. He eventually left Sears to begin a new Career in Real Estate. When Elaine retired from teaching in 1994, they moved back to NC

to be close to family. After settling in NC, Tom and Elaine became parishioners of St Francis of Assisi Catholic Church in Raleigh. Tom then made the decision to attend RCIA program and converted to Catholicism in 1998. He was invited to join the Knights of Columbus and took his First Degree in March of 1999. Tom eventually progressed through the officers' chairs, serving as Grand Knights for All Saints Council for 2 years. During his tenure as GK, the council was recognized as Double Star and State Deputy's award. Tom was recognized several times by the council as Knight of the Month, Knight of the Year and Family of the Year. In October of 2002, Tom became a Sir Knight joining Bishop McGuiness Assembly 778 eventually serving as Faithful Navigator. Tom has been very active in support of

Veterans and a Durham VA Medical Center representative for 12 yrs. He was also appointed the first VA Rep for the State of NC Knights of Columbus and further appointed Chairman for Veterans Affairs for the State K of C. For his dedicated service to veterans and the K of C, Tom was honored as the K of C VAVs Volunteer of the Year by the Order. Elaine is always by his side as they travel the State in Support of Veterans and, because of their dedication., were recognized as the 2016 Family of the Year by the K of C NC State Council.

Tom and Elaine were married on June 22, 1968 and this year will celebrate their 50th Wedding Anniversary. They have two children, Michele and Brian and four grandchildren.

Tom continues his passion in support of Veterans, attends 3rd and 4th Degrees to encourage Brother Knights to participate in programs supporting all Veterans.

Tom was also responsible for helping bring 20 Brother Knights from Council 9709 to take the 4th Degree at the very same Exemplification that received his recognition.

The discussion was presented during 4 sessions of the Crosswalk program to approximately 200 youth. group leaders and a few parents. Here's how it works: each year during the month of May the Knights collect names of deceased veterans from our parishioners to be added to a Military Roll. Just this year alone 73 new names were added on bringing the grand total to over 600 deceased veterans on the Military Roll. Then, on Memorial Day a Mass is offered for these deceased veterans while the names of the newly enrolled veterans are read aloud. Michael Darrow, our Grand Knight, had the honor of reading their names. This year imme-

diately following Mass a deceased veteran, William Boileau, Tech Sgt. US Army (died on April 15, 1995) who never received military honors was finally honored by the National Guard during which his family received the American flag from the United States government.

ELECTED OFFICERS

GRAND KNIGHT - The Grand Knight is responsible for the welfare of the Council. He presides over Council meetings, acts as an ex-officio member of all Committees, appoints the Membership and Programming Directors, convenes officers for a monthly meeting and ensures all necessary reports are submitted to the State and Supreme Councils. The Grand Knight's signature appears on all checks drawn.

DEPUTY GRAND KNIGHT - The Deputy Grand Knight assists the Grand Knight with Council affairs and fulfills all the duties assigned him by the Grand Knight. Should the Grand Knight be absent from a Council meeting, the Deputy Grand Knight will preside. He is also Chairman of the Council's Retention Committee.

CHANCELLOR - The Chancellor assists the Grand Knight and Deputy Grand Knight in the execution of their duties and oversees the Council in both their absences. He is charged with strengthening the members' interests in Council activities and is also Chairman of the Admissions Committee.

WARDEN - The Warden is the "watchdog" for Council property and degree paraphernalia, except the property of the Financial Secretary, Treasurer and Recorder. He is responsible for setting up the Council Chambers for meetings and ceremonial work and appoints and supervises guards during ceremonial exemplifications.

TREASURER - The Treasurer is responsible for the safekeeping and maintaining of records of all Council funds and accounts. He is responsible for depositing money into the Council's accounts and provides certificates of such monies to the Grand Knight. He is also responsible of payment of all expenses.

RECORDER - The Recorder is responsible for maintaining a true record of all actions of the Council and its correspondence.

ADVOCATE - The Advocate is the legal representative of the Council and serves as the Council's attorney at trials and investigations of interest to the Council. While he does not need to be a member of the legal profession, he should be familiar with the Council By Laws, Methods of Conducting a Council Meeting and Robert's Rules of Order.

INSIDE AND OUTSIDE GUARDS - The Outside Guard tends to the outer door admitting visitors and members to the inner door. Once at the inner door, the Inside Guard checks to make sure that membership cards are current.

TRUSTEES - The Board of Trustees consists of three members elected by the Council and the Grand Knight, who serves as Chairman. They oversee the work of the Financial Secretary and Treasurer, and with the Deputy Grand Knight, serve on the Council's Retention Committee. Only the three-year Trustee is voted, with the others continuing their terms.
