The fall Blood Drive is a coordinated effort between our Council and the Red Cross. This year's results, a final count of 134 units of blood, was another success thanks to Brother Bryan Kozak and a supporting cast populated by our Brothers, the Boy Scouts and SFA students. Brother Bryan worked tirelessly weeks before the event signing up donors before and after Masses while Brother Tom DuPree hit the road visiting restaurants and super markets asking for free food and drinks to feed the donors. Between the hours of 11:00 am and 1:00 pm on the day of the event several Brothers embarked on a food run collecting the promised donations while Maria and Steve Nichols maintained control of the kitchen by keeping some food warm in the ovens and doling out the food as needed for consumption. Finally, around 4:00 pm as the blood donations were concluding and the Red Cross personnel began to pack up for departure, a team of Knights and other volunteers started the arduous process of cleaning up Clare Hall, dismantling and storing tables and chairs to end the long day. Hopefully, we are able to continue this humanitarian work because there is always a desperate need for life-saving blood, and sadly, it is always in short supply.
