

## **Scouts Annual Flag Retirement Ceremony**





The Knights are supportive of Scout Troop 352 each year as they perform their annual flag retirement ceremony.

Each year the Scouts of America, Troop 352, retire American flags. On November 5, the traditional ceremony was conducted at St. Francis of Assisi in the garden next to the Founders room. The retirement consisted of burning old, faded flags which have been collected by the Scouts. Our Council joined the Scouts completing this ceremony. In preparation, the flags are carefully torn apart first by separating the stripes, which represent the original 13 colonies, then leaving the stars as the last piece. Finally, each piece is carried by a Scout and deposited in a fire while giving a final salute.










## A PLACE AT THE TABLE
