

Additionally, Bryan knew that people were suffering from the lockdowns, so he directed the Council to continue the Catholic Charity food drives to satisfy the critical need. By choosing the Kozaks as Family of the Year is testament to how much the Council recognized Bryan's dedication and support he received from his family.

MEMORIAL MASS





MEMORIAL DAY MASS

Our Council, in coordination with Monsignor Clay, honored the men and women who served in the military, and have since passed away, with a Memorial Day Mass on Monday, May 30th. During the Mass FN Jack McDonnell read the names of the deceased veterans who were added to the roll this year. The roll now contains over 800 names that have been collected at St. Francis over the past several years. Following the Mass, a military honor ceremony took place in Memorial Garden for SK Richard (Dick) Novacek who passed away on January 20, 2021. Kelsey Novacek, Richard's son, traveled to Raleigh from Washington, DC, to receive the honors. SK Dave Van Nett directed the ceremony as well as collecting the names of deceased veterans who were added to the roll this year.





STATIONS OF THE CROSS









Once again, our Council sponsored the Stations of the Cross on Good Friday. Parishioners were invited to attend the solemn ceremony, which occurred utdoors beginning in the TFS courtyard then continuing among the school buildings, pausing in front of St. Mary of the Angels Chapel, on through the labvrinth and concluding in Memorial Garden. Several Brothers, along with a few of their family members, conducted the prayers at each station. After Father Jim opened the service with a welcome and a prayer, PGK Michael Wrzesien began with the prayers for the 1st station, "Jesus is condemned to death." PGK Bob Weisenberger ended the trek with prayers of the 14th station, "Jesus laid in the tomb." From the first until the last station, the prayerful assembly of about 110 parishioners attended the event, which provided the nexus to begin the celebration of our Lord's promise, His Resurrection.

COFFEE AND DONUTS

Our Council was asked to host the Coffee and Donuts event on Sunday, April 24th to begin after the 9:00 am Mass. This was only the second Coffee and Donut undertaking in nearly two years, which had been stalled due to the Covid-era. Parishioners have always supported this occasion, so we were expecting a large turnout. A team of eight Brothers volunteered to portion-out the donuts, prepare the coffee, lemonade and all the ancillary items to ensure a successful affair. Sure enough, a large crowd descended on Fellowship/Clare Hall after Mass and nearly filled the room. Monsignor Clay, Father Jairo and Seminarian Cong Le also attended the social gathering.

On Saturday, May 14th, The Great Strides Walk was organized to support of the Cystic Fibrosis Foundation. Answering the call were Brothers Ron McGrath, Michael Ames, Pat and Karen Sauter, Joe Noonan and his grandson Dillon, and Tony Rivezzo. Mike Rock and his wife Mary Beth are extremely involved with the foundation. They created the Angelica's Angels, named after their daughter, to raise funds for the foundation. Amazingly, The Angelica's Angels raised \$10,000. By year end the CF Foundation is expected to raise \$210,000.

Salisbury VA director and Navy Veteran Joseph Vaughn watched as the Veterans interacted with the robotic pets and told stories of his own animals and how they make him feel

"I have pets, and I know the love and joy they bring to one's life," Vaughn said. "I am excited that the CLC residents have the opportunity to receive these pets and hopefully it will bring a smile to their faces."
