THE FATHER DAVID MCBRIAR LIFETIME ACHIEVEMENT AWARD

In the fraternal year 2022-2023, Ralph Guenther was chosen by his peers to be the recipient of the prestigious lifetime achievement award. Fifty-six years ago, on April 1st, 1967, Ralph joined the Knights of Columbus in Paramus, New Jersey. His journey took him to Council 8600, Fairfax, Virginia, then eventually transferring to All Saints Council in 1989, which at the time, was led by Charter Grand Knight, Larry Dudley. Ralph, as an active member of the council, helped it grow from when it took 9 members to form a guorum to today's membership of over 250 strong. Along the way, Ralph created the Parking Ministry, was and continues to be a devoted volunteer for the Special Olympics, led its aquatics activity for 5 years, won the GOAT award for his team selling the most raffle tickets for the council in 2022, has always served as part of the leadership team sharing his wisdom and experience. In FY 2014-2015 Ralph was chosen the Golden Knight of the Year of All Saints Council and the State Council. Ralph's crown achievement occurred when he was elected Grand Knight of All Saints Council, FY 1994-1995. Amazingly, he was succeeded by his son, Grand Knight John Guenther, FY 1996-1997. To quote Ralph, "I am proud to be in All Saints Council 9709 as one of the largest and well run and one of, if not the best council in the State of North Carolina at 84 years of age with 56 of those years as a proud Knight of Columbus."

The Durham Bulls had another successful season on the baseball diamond, claiming a division championship for the second half of the season, and playing in the International League Championship Series. The thousands of fans that attended the games were treated to winning baseball and a great family atmosphere.

The Brother Knights of the All Saints Council also had a successful season in supporting the Durham Bulls by volunteering their time to serve the best fans in baseball. The Knights worked at a beer cart and the Chicken Wings stand to raise funds for non-profit organizations in the Raleigh/Durham area. Brother Knights were able to enjoy fellowship -- working side-by-side with their Brothers -- at each game, while knowing their volunteer time had a direct connection to helping men and women in our community who need our financial sup-



port and our continued care and compassion. The money raised from our efforts funds local charities through the All Saints Council's philanthropic program. Programs such as Catholic Parish Outreach, Coats for Kids, Operation LAMB, and Veterans Affairs (any many other organizations) all received financial donations from our Council due to the efforts of the Brother Knights and their wives who volunteered at a Durham Bulls game this season.

The All Saints Council raised approximately \$18,000 this season. That is AMAZ-ING. Your commitment of time to serve has a significant impact on the lives of so many people in our community.

Over the course of the baseball season, the Knights worked at 27 games. Most games required six volunteers. Brother Knights, and their wives, filled 134 shifts, giving approximately 804 hours of volunteer time.
